Meeting Minutes of December 18, 2025

**CALL TO ORDER:** President Hawley called the December 18, 2025 meeting of the Drone Flyers Club to order at 18:30 hours. Hawley welcomed all those in attendance.

## CLUB OFFICER REPORTS

Cres has been a great Safety Officer and worked to make flying safer for our entire membership. Hawley thanked Cres for his assistance to the Club. ## NEW BUSINESS

- **Bylaw Update:** Secretary Justus reported that the Bylaw committee continues to meet and has submitted a copy of the proposed changes to membership via email. Only two requests for minor changes to the existing bylaws were submitted and those changes were made. Justus then presented a comparison of the bylaws, highlighting the existing (in red type) with the proposed change (in green type).

Justus further reported that should there be no issues with the updated copy a motion will be requested to waive the second reading and adopt the updated Bylaws at the January 2026 meeting.

**Motion and second** to distribute and send a copy of the comparison to membership and to approve the draft copy.

**Motion approved** by voice vote.

- **2026 Budget:** President Hawley reported the Executive Board has been working on preparing the budget for 2026. It is anticipated our expenses will remain similar to the 2025 budget and that no additional assessments or dues increase was anticipated. As a result, the membership dues for 2026 will remain at the current rate of \$20.00 per member.
- **2026 Dues:** As the budget anticipates no increase to dues, Secretary Justus will send out an invoice to the members. Dues will be due no later than the date of the February 2026 Club meeting. Persons not submitting their dues will be removed from membership at that time. - **FPV News:** Allen Wan presented the FPV report. Topics included:
  - The RadioMaster T8L ELRS radio. It's a great radio and low cost.
  - The BetaFPV HD RTF Kit is available for pre-order.
  - Artlynx has introduced a new safety system that will be available soon.
  - Steam Winter is currently having a sale on their FPV drone simulators.
  - DJI O4 Air units are available on Pyrodrone or GetPVP websites. Both are limited supply.

## OPEN DISCUSSION:

- **Bucket Challenge:** John Egan presented an informative presentation on the "Bucket Challenge". This is an excellent way for drone flyers to improve their flying skills and become more proficient. This is an actual flying event and involves five distinct levels, each building on the others. The is an FAA/FAST online program and endorsed by NIST (National Institute

for Standards and Technology). The training involves flying a course that focuses on three 5-gallon buckets and photographing different angles. While low cost, the course provides challenging tasks. Students wishing to take the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> level of this training would be flying indoors and in enclosed spaces. Egan showed a video of the various skill levels.

This is also the second part to the FAA Wings program in which small tokens are provided to those able to demonstrate the skills learned. The Club is now looking at acquiring the components needed. Egan has already been able to acquire most of the components at no cost from local business.

A link to this program will be posted to our webpage.

A positive discussion was held on this topic and the Club will begin looking for locations to conduct the program for those interested in participating.

**SAFETY OFFICER:** Safety Officer Cres Wise was unable to attend this evening's meeting. I am reposting a recent briefing Cres gave to keep everyone focused on safe flying

- Drone take off/landing area
  - Announce your intentions
    - Take off, landing, etc.
  - Minimize your time in the takeoff and landing area
  - Drone and pilot face the same direction
- Operator Area
  - Cross behind the pilot whenever possible
  - Keep behind the safety line/cones
- When Flying:
  - 200 ft transit over the adjacent Soaring Eagle ball field
  - 100 ft transit over air gun range
  - Don't fly over Edna's, starter shack, pool, or persons

- Use caution over walking path and pitch & putt areas
- Before Flight:
  - Confirm software and firmware are up-to-date
  - Inspect your aircraft before flight
  - Batteries inspected and charged. If battery is deformed, dispose of it properly
  - Weather check: Personal minimums and predicted weather
  - Airspace. Be aware of where you are not allowed to fly

On the website, select “Safety Information” to review helpful safety information prior to flying. You can also click on “Part 107 information” for links to information provided by The Pilot Institute (a partner of our Club) where you can find in-depth information on many of the drones flown by members of the Club.

Members were reminded, if they have not already done so, to complete the FAA’s Trust Exam. This is a short exam that is required for all persons flying drones.

Additional items to consider:

- Aircraft marking (registration). Make sure your drone is displaying its FAA number. Non-107 pilots have a single FAA registration for all their drones. FAA 107 pilots are required to have a registration number for each of their drone. Registration numbers must be displayed on the exterior of each drone.
- FAA recommends pilots have a minimum of 15 satellites visible when flying.
- Check the KP index (sun interference with satellites) prior to flying to determine whether conditions are favorable to flying.
